

Psalm 118(117):2-4. 22-24. 25-27a. R. 1




- 1/. Let the house of Israel say,

Psalm 30(29):2, 4. 5-6. 11, 12a, 13b. R. 2a



 He made us; we belong to him.


 We are his people, the sheep of his flock.

I will bless your name for ever, my God and king.






- 1/. The LORD is kind and full of compassion, slow to anger, abounding in mercy.How good is the LORD to all, compassionate to all his creatures.

Psalm 67(66):2-3. 5. 6, 8. R. 4





 The LORD goes up with trumpet blast.


 Sing praise for God; sing praise!
