

- 2/. You delight not in sacrifice and offering, but in an open ear.


You do not ask for holocaust <u>and</u> sin offering. Then I said, 'Behold, <u>I</u> have come.'





- 3/. With a steadfast heart he will not fear.



- 2/. But I pray to you, O LORD, at an acceptable time.


 In your great mercy, answer me, O God, with your faithful salvation.
