

 and recount the deeds <u>of</u> the LORD.


 The LORD has punished <u>me</u> severely,

Give praise to the LORD, for he is good;




Fifth Sunday of Easter Year B

Psalm 22(21):26b-27. 28, 30. 31-32. R. 26a








Sixth Sunday of Easter Year B

Psalm 98(97):1. 2-3b. 3c-4. R. cf. 2b




- 1/. O sing a new song to the LORD, for he has worked wonders.His right hand and his holy arm have brought salvation.

- 1/. All peoples, <u>clap</u> your hands.


 Cry to God with <u>shouts</u> of joy!
